Account of incidents of interest that occurred on 15/16 April 2008

On 15 April 2008, the Northwest Regional Police received a report from a citizen of finding two rifles in the Chiques Creek off of Milton Grove Rd.. On responding to the area Officer Ken Neidinger recovered a .22 caliber Marlin rifle and a .22 caliber Glenfield rifle from the creek. The Northwest Regional Police are continuing the investigation and request anyone with information regarding the rifles contact them at 717-367-8481.



At 1500 hrs. on 15 April 2008, Lieutenant Mark Mayberry of the Northwest Regional Police was dispatched to Buckingham Blvd. and Radio Rd. in Mt. Joy Twp. for a traffic accident. When Lieutenant Mayberry arrived in the area, he found a 1994 Jeep Cherokee had crashed into a large Pine tree off of Radio Rd.. The driver and 3 passengers in the Jeep Cherokee were not injured in the accident.

Lt. Mayberry determined that the driver, a 17 YOA Elizabethtown resident, was traveling too fast to make the turn onto Radio Rd. from Buckingham Blvd. Due to the excessive speed, the driver was unable to maintain control of the vehicle causing the vehicle to leave the roadway and collide with the tree. The driver will be sent a summons for "Driving Vehicle at a Safe Speed".



At 0048 hrs. on 16 April 2008 due to a report of a vehicle being operated erratically, Officer Dan George of the Northwest Regional Police was in the area of Zeager Rd. off of N. Market St. in W. Donegal Twp.. While checking for the vehicle Officer George located a Ford Ranger pick-up truck in a ditch off the roadway.

Off. George determined that Karl J. Boltz M/44 YOA of the 1800 block of Brubaker Run Rd., Lancaster, PA was the lone occupant and driver of the pick-up truck. While speaking to Boltz, Off. George found him to be unsteady on his feet. Off. George



administered field sobriety tests and subsequently a portable breath test to Boltz at the scene. Both tests resulted in a failure of Boltz to complete the tests satisfactorily.

Boltz was taken into custody for Driving Under the Influence. He subsequently was transported to the Northwest Regional Police Station where two additional breath tests were administered to Boltz. These tests resulted in breath alcohol content readings of .211% and .202%. Off. George will be filing Driving Under the Influence and Carless Driving charges against Boltz.
